For those of us who have come to enjoy Ben Hood's exploits, this book is a bit of a departure from previous tales, as instead of working security, Ben is called in to assist with the investigation of a government official's missing wife. She has wandered off before, but something is different about this case and Ben is quickly on the trail of this "Lost Lady". Behind the missing woman is another, even more sinister mystery and the clock is ticking not only for Lara's life but for many others unaware of the danger. The author is a past master at building suspense and my only complaint in this book is that the story seemed to fly by too fast. Also, we get to see some real emotion from Ben, a character who admits he is damaged goods and who has a hard time expressing his true feelings.

A great read by Lindsay Hood plain rocks. This one starts with a missing lady. She's the much younger wife of the Australian Minister for Foreign Affairs Sir Philip Ashton. The lady in question, Lara Ashton, has gone missing before but has always come back within a couple of days. Peta Hartley is a Detective Inspector and is in charge of the squad looking for Lara. No luck so far. Peta Hartley has twelve years as an LEO and she's one tough lady. A lady who was beaten and shot by her husband. A lady who has no liking for men at all. She's also a black belt in karate. She's one tough bitch. Superintendent Roger Heise is the Chief of the Federal Police. He's also a good friend of Rodney Reid who's Ben Hood's employer. Heise has asked Rod to get Ben Hood to come and help investigate the disappearance. Rod agrees but he also knows he's going to have to talk Ben into it. It's the Christmas season and Ben wants a vacation and isn't keen on any work at this point. Ben isn't keen on it but Rod talks him into it. National Security and all that. Ben agrees to go. Hartley meets him at the airport and it's hate on sight on her part. So begins one damned fine read. This one has Ben, Peta, a plan to kill many, a kidnapping, a rescue, crocodiles, Ben and Peta getting close, death, betrayal, revenge and Ben Hood getting it done one more time. Five Stars again.

I really love this author. His main character, Ben Hood is so strong and yet so gentle. I like the fact that he is an older man. He is an expert in the martial arts. In this novel, Ben Hood is hired to find the wife of a missing diplomat. She has run away before but this time he finds out that she had been kidnapped by some Arab terrorists.
