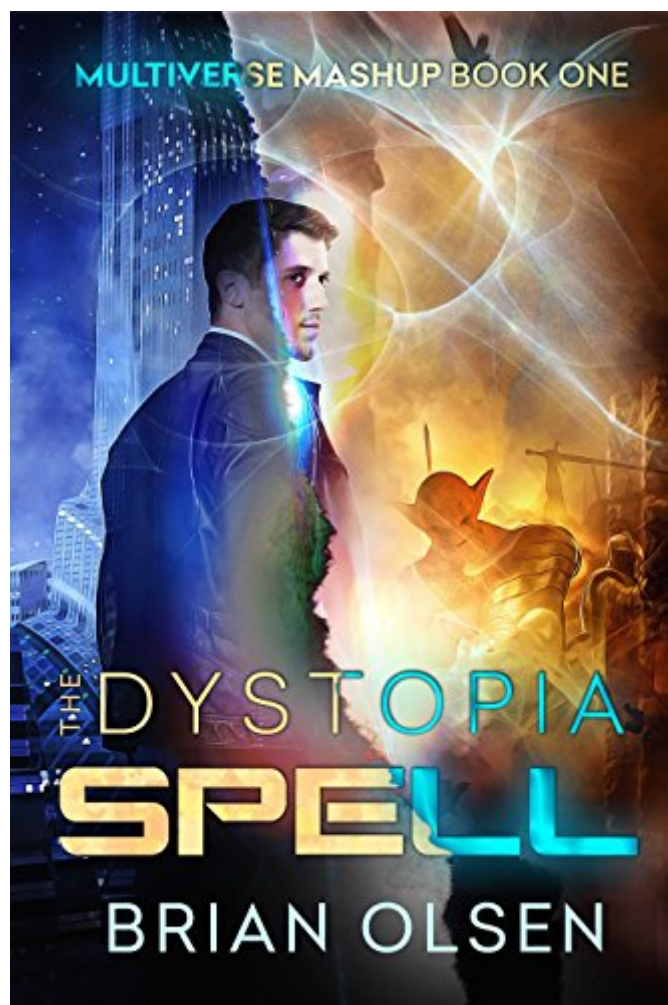

I am not usually the biggest fan of Sci-Fi, mostly because I am terrible at keeping track of weirdly named characters, places, and powers, but this book was an easy read. It reads just like regular human on Earth fiction, only much more fun. There is a definite "Torchwood" vibe, and a lot of humor. The main character is gay (bi?), but this detail is just worked into the plot naturally. Gender

norms and societal norms are tossed out the window, but without feeling forced or obvious. How much you contemplate it afterward is totally up to you. The book is just a lot of fun, and I hope the start of a series.

While I'm not big on Dystopian sci-fi, I loved this story. It was a bit telegraphed at times, but I think that may be because I grew up a D&D nerd in the 80's (Heck, I still am, but I've moved on to Pathfinder), and I kinda saw things coming. Irregardless, I highly recommend you get yourself a copy and dig in to this feast of action, romance and buddy road-trip all in one story. One thing about the stories I've read from Brian Olsen, is that nobody ever seems ashamed of their sexuality. I wish I lived in a world where someone would proclaim their preference in a partner, and everybody else would simply shrug as if to say, "whatever." I don't think this is much of a spoiler to say, but I wanted to smack our hero, Jed, upside the head. For someone who appears to be omnisexual and has little to no reservations on who he is attracted to, how can he not see the obvious when it is right in front of him? Will one thing lead to another? Will it be a June wedding... someday? I kinda hope not. I like the notion of Jed being Jed and living vicariously through his exploits. I mean really.. Who hasn't wondered if an elf is as pointed in other places as his ears are? I really like the concept of this series and am chomping at the bit for more. Finally there is a realistic way to have magic in a sci-fi setting and for someone like me who demands realism in his fantasy world, I give a big pat on the head and a cookie to Mr. Olsen for finding a way to give that to me.

This book is just a hoot! The main character is a swashbuckling rogue you just want to hang out with, the premise of the story itself is unique in its familiarity, and it is just fun! Brian Olsen does an amazing job.

Love Dungeons & Dragons? Love The Hunger Games? Now you can have the best of both worlds and more with "Dystopia Spell". The action keeps on coming and coming as do the laughs from with humor. Couldn't put this one down.
