My rating is based on being misled. The book specifically said it was a clean read, which it was not. It's too bad since the author did well in portraying the chemistry between the two main characters and didn't need to rely on sex scenes to hold the readers attention.

I didn't care for this one. The writing was awkward and stiff at times. I found myself glossing over a lot of it because it was tough to read and skipped to the dialog. As for the plot...I found it incredibly weak. We find out early on that Sarah is Jack and Amanda's but there is never a good enough reason given as to why Cassie didn't tell him years ago. A selfish sister? A mom suffering from dementia? Not good enough reasons. Cassie is supposed to be the responsible and sensible one; it just doesn't make any logical sense. I was a bit disappointed with this one. While this was classified as "clean," there was some suggestive language that typically wouldn't be included in "clean" novels.

SPOILER ALERT!!! I don't think I have ever given a one star before. I had a hard time reading about Cassie not telling Jack that Sarah was his. I won't read books knowing the father is kept from knowing he has child unless it would be for security reasons. Even though it has a HEA it isn't till the end of the book. I skimmed through a lot of it just hoping she would tell him. Just my preference. There is enough in the world with the father not being able to see their children.
