

If you are only going to tourist areas, you can just speak english. However, the people there like it if you try to speak spanish and you will get better prices on things if you do.

Costa Rican Spanish is subtly different. Even though you can travel to CR without knowing any Spanish, it is just plain rude to do so. We used our high school Spanish and got along just fine. This book was very helpful in subtle translations - Translations that stand out in my memory a year later: How to ask for a fill-up as all gas stations are full service and translating some of the road signs regarding livestock.

I really like how this book is divided into categories. Short grammatical lessons at the front serve as a good, if very basic start to understanding the language if one has an interest in going beyond

learning vocabulary for a short trip. And if you're not interested in the grammar lessons, the bulk of this book is still perfect for those wishing to just pick up the necessary vocabulary and polite greetings. It's very small in size, easy to toss in a bag without taking up much space at all. Well worth the minor investment.

I've used Lonely Planet phrasebooks in several countries and languages. They're a life saver. Not a substitute for learning a bit of the language, but an invaluable tool. Buy the phrase book and the travel guide for what ever country(s) you plan to visit. I assure you, it's money well spent.Oh..... And check out their on line forum.
